Notification of the Ministry of Public Health (No.345) B.E.2555 (2012)

Title: Prescribed Prohibited Foods to be Produced, Imported or Sold.

It deems appropriate to amend the regulatory measures for genetically modified maize containing Cry9C DNA sequence.

By virtue of articles 5 and 6(8) of the Food Act B.E. 2522 (1979), which restricts person rights and liberties in conjunction with articles 29, 33, 41, 43 and 45 of the Constitution of the Kingdom of Thailand, the Minister of Public Health by the recommendations of the Food Committee; announced as follows:

Clause 1. The following notifications shall be repealed:

- (1) The Ministry of Public Health Notification (No. 215) B.E.2544 (2001) entitled: "Prescribed prohibited foods to be produced, imported or sold" dated 18 January B.E.2544 (2001).
- (2) The Ministry of Public Health Notification (No. 217) B.E.2544 (2001) entitled: "Amendment of the Notification of the Ministry of Public Health (No. 215) B.E. 2544 (2001)" dated 8 June B.E.2544 (2001).
- (3) The Ministry of Public Health Notification (No. 246) B.E.2544 (2001) entitled: "Amendment of the Notification of the Ministry of Public Health (No. 217) B.E. 2544 (2001)" dated 28 November B.E.2544 (2001).
- Clause 2. Genetically modified food containing Cry9C DNA Sequence and food containing such genetically modified food, shall be prohibited to be produced, imported or sold.

Clause 3. This Notification comes into force the day after its announcement in the Royal Gazette.
